DRESS CODE POLICY

Mindarie Senior College has a Dress Code Policy determined in consultation with parents and students. All students attending the College must wear the full College uniform as sold by the College and are not allowed to modify the uniform, nor wear it in an inappropriate way.

- Hats are not to be worn inside classrooms.
- Durags (head scarf) are not allowed to be worn.
- Leggings (including footless tights) are not allowed to be worn.
- Safety footwear is compulsory at Mindarie Senior College, and must be appropriate for the activity. Students are to wear closed-in shoes.
- Thongs or backless shoes are not permitted.

The uniform can be ordered and purchased directly from Tudor Uniforms throughout the year. Tudor Uniforms also sell uniforms from Student Services during Thursday lunch times.

Students who are in breach of the College Dress Code Guidelines must report to Student Services upon arrival at the College. The following consequences will be actioned:

1st breach – First warning. A uniform pass will be issued. An email will be sent home informing parents/guardians of the uniform breach. Students not wearing College uniform may be required to change clothes or asked to go home to change in to uniform.

2nd breach – Second warning. A uniform pass will be issued. An email will be sent home informing parents/guardians of the second uniform breach. Any further College Dress Code breach will involve a move to Loss of Good Standing Level 1. Students not wearing College uniform may be required to change clothes or asked to go home to change in to uniform.

3rd breach – Loss of Good Standing. The student will be moved to Loss of Good Standing Level 1 as a result of their third breach of the College Dress Code. An email will be sent home informing parents/guardians of the third uniform breach.

Continual breaches – If the student continues to breach the College Dress Code Policy, this will result in a subsequent move to Loss of Good Standing Level 2 and/or 3. This may result in consequences such as suspension from timetabled classes.
