

DRESS CODE POLICY AND GUIDELINES

Mindarie Senior College has a Dress Code Policy determined in consultation with parents and students. All students attending the College must wear the full College uniform and are not allowed to modify the uniform, nor wear it in an inappropriate way.

- Uniform is to be worn as intended.
- Only items of College uniform purchased through Tudor Uniforms may be worn. Any other item is unacceptable.
- Hats are not to be worn inside classrooms.
- Durags (head scarf) are not allowed to be worn.
- Leggings (including footless tights) are not allowed to be worn. The exception to this is during dance or drama subjects, but students must change back into uniform after class.
- In the winter or cooler weather, only the College fleece hoodie, waterproof jacket or Year 12 leavers tops or jackets may be worn, however, students may wear long sleeve tops under their College polo shirts. Please note that no brand name words should be visible.
- Jewellery may be worn, but if it is deemed a health hazard, and against OSH standards, then it must be removed.
- Safe footwear is compulsory at Mindarie Senior College and must be appropriate for the activity. Students are to wear closed-in shoes. The following items of footwear are not permitted:
 - Ugg boots
 - Crocs
 - Slides
 - Thongs
 - Backless shoes

The uniform can be ordered and purchased directly from Tudor Uniforms throughout the year.

Uniform choices include:

- Shorts (3 styles)
- Tracksuit pants
- Light blue short sleeved polo shirt
- Navy blue short sleeved polo shirt (PE uniform)
- Fleece hoodie
- Waterproof jacket

Students who are in breach of the College Dress Code Guidelines must report to Student Services upon arrival at the College. Alternatively, if the student forgets to do this, a staff member can send them directly to Student Services.

If a student is out of uniform, they have three options of support:

1. Borrow clean, washed uniform items belonging to Student Services; to be returned at the end of the day.
2. Make immediate arrangements to have their uniform dropped off at Student Services.
3. If an alternative arrangement cannot be made and the student refuses to follow staff instructions by borrowing a spare uniform, they will be instructed to work from Student Services for the day.

Uniform passes will only be issued to students in extreme cases, such as homelessness or major damage to the home resulting in the student's uniform being deemed beyond repair. In this instance, the College will endeavour to support the student(s) with replacement uniform items, wherever possible. Failure to follow the College dress code process may result in further consequences being issued in consultation with parents/guardians.
